Drive to Corryong and visit

Return from Corryong along the Murray River Road which flows between the Snowy Mountains to the Murray. A really lovely drive. You pass through places such as Towong (where you can see the beautiful racecourse, site of famous Annual New Year Races & where Phar Lap was filmed and Farrans Lookout (a view to behold). Also travel through Walwa, Granya & Bellbridge.

A small detour of about 500 metres (not far from Albury) will take you to the Hume Dam Wall/Spillway from which you can look back at the weir or over the spillway down to the river. The weir is 6 times the size of Sydney Harbour (volume)

And a short drive through Winton Wetlands. It was originally known as Lake Mokoan by the traditional owners and has a contentious history.

Between 1967 and 1971 a 7.5 k rock wall was built to flood the wetland and make a reservoir for irrigation. This drowned roughly 200,000 mature river red gums the remains of which you will see to this day.

It was eventually decommissioned between 2004 and 2009 by the Vic Govt. due to the high evaporation rate (was very shallow). This led to a lot of community protest. Today it is undergoing restoration and is the largest wetlands restoration project in the southern hemisphere. Unfortunately the river red gums cannot be brought back to life.

Late lunch at Glenrowan – own arrangements for lunch. You may just want a snack as dinner is at 6.00pm.

Have a look at town, including new Ned Kelly Museum.
